 - Discuss both sides of this argument and give your opinion. Give reasons for your answer and include any relevant examples from your own knowledge or experience.
- 4. The best way to help underperforming pupils is to have compulsory after school activities that they must attend. This way they will become more involved in school and their grades will improve.
